

Temporary Local Rule

Abnormal Course Condition – Log piles

When a player's ball touches, lies within or is in close proximity to the log piles near the base of the dead trees on hole 1/10 and hole 4/13, in such a way as to physically interfere with the player's stance or intended swing, the player may take free relief in the following manner under Rule 16.1a

Reference point: the nearest point not nearer the hole that offers complete relief from the condition.

Relief area: ball must be dropped within one club length the reference point but not nearer the hole so that it comes to rest in the relief area.

Note. If the original ball is not immediately recoverable or is cut or damaged, another ball may be dropped. Rule 14 2a

If the ball does not come to rest after being dropped twice, it may be placed in the relief area. Rule 14.3c

There is no relief if it is clearly unreasonable to play the ball because of something other than the Abnormal Ground Condition or because the club chosen, type of stance or swing, or direction of play is not reasonable in the circumstances.

Playing from the wrong place – General Penalty (2 strokes)
